NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING #1

Monday, March 21, 2016 at 2:30 p.m.

Medina County Administration Building, 144 N. Broadway, Medina, Ohio

The Medina County Board of Commissioners intends to apply to the Ohio Development Services Agency, Office of Community Development for funding under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Year 2016 Community Development Program, a federally funded program and other related programs administered by the State of Ohio, Development Services Agency. Medina County is eligible to apply for PY 2016 funding under the Community Development Allocation Program (approximately CDBG - \$178,000) as well as the Neighborhood Revitalization (CDBG - \$300,000), Downtown Revitalization (CDBG - \$300,000) and Critical Infrastructure (CDBG - \$300,000) competitive set-aside programs, Residential Public Infrastructure (CDBG - \$500,000), Economic Development (CDBG - \$500,000), Discretionary (\$ varies), and Community Housing Impact and Preservation Program (CHIP) (CDBG/HOME/OTHF - \$450,000) grants provided the County meets applicable program requirements. The County may elect to partner with another Medina County community for Community Housing Impact and Preservation funds

The first of two (or more) public hearings will be held Monday, March 21, 2016 at 2:30 p.m. in the Medina County Commissioners Meeting Room located at 144 North Broadway, Medina, Ohio 44256, to provide citizens with pertinent information about the CDBG and HOME programs including an explanation of eligible activities and program requirements. The CDBG program can fund a broad range of activities, including: economic development projects, streets, water supply, drainage and sanitary sewer improvements, park acquisition and improvements, demolition of unsafe structures, rehabilitation of housing, and neighborhood facilities. The activities must be designed to primarily benefit low and moderate income persons, aid in the prevention or elimination of slum and blight, or meet an urgent need of the community.

Citizens are encouraged to attend this meeting on Monday, March 21, 2016 at 2:30 p.m. to provide their input on the County's CDBG program. No final decisions regarding projects will be made at this hearing.
